Christmas should represent a moment of healing and renewed strength: it takes us into a common ritual reviving lights and hopes on the hearth. Every year, while we're putting up the Nativity scene or decorating a Christmas tree we go back in our memory, founding we're doing something we know since we were little girls or boys, handed down from father to son. This is true mainly for parishes, as underlined in his homily by our parish priest don Antonio Laurita during the midnight Christmas mass; at the end, an ancient little statue of the Holy Child, just renovated, has been taken in procession to S. Antonio church. On Christmas day, don Rocco Piro celebrated the mass at the Main Church, and in the evening it took place in S.Rocco church. The decision to use all churches of the town has been taken to allow everybody to attend.

This year we had the 6th edition of "*The Crib into the Crib*", an event that wants to improve the sense of belonging to Pignola's community setting up several Cribs, thus sharing the Christmas spirit; and also the parish community was involved, so the various groups prepared a Crib in each church.

On S.Stefano day, in S.Rocco church the parish children did a performance about the Nativity, with songs and dialogues in English, driven by Catholic Action, whose members should be really appreciated for their efforts in helping our kids to grow in a Christian way.

Finally we had the "live nativity scene", held in the suggestive scenery of the Priscinia cave, where people met to celebrate the Mystery of Bethlehem; looking at the Holy Child in the cave our spiritual life should restart, reanimated by the "true" Christmas presents.

Feast of Santa Lucia

Dec. 13, 2014

Since a couple of years in Pignola there is a group of volunteers that organises the celebrations in honour of Santa Lucia, which is greatly revered in our town.

This year the team (Filomena Chirieleison, Nina Coiro, Gina Fusco, Vincenza Lauria, Angela Montagna, Adriana Pietrafesa, Carolina Vista), has undertaken some initiatives to enhance a tradition that was declining. Therefore they started involving young people (school groups) in realizing the traditional "*Lace*", something that seemed to have been forgotten in our technological era.

Then, the Santa Lucia day began with the sound of pipers from Viggiano that have been going through the streets, together with a Santa Claus giving sweets to children. Our parish priest don Antonio celebrated the Mass in the typical little church, with a great attendance, including several pupils and teachers.

In the afternoon, in the presence of the Mayor Gerardo Ferretti and the Councillor for Culture Cristiano Lauria, the "Laces" have been measured, and the class "2nd A" was awarded first prize, having realized a 112 meters lace! All participants received anyway the medal with the effigy of the Saint.

After the second Mass of the day the procession took place; when the Saint reached her church, many white and luminous balloons flew to the sky. Then, "U' Catuozz', the traditional bonfire prepared by Marino Napolitano, was ignited while at the same time fireworks where illuminating the clear sky.

At the end Angela Montagna, a soprano from Pignola which is also a committee member, sang some Christmas carols, arousing great emotion among people.

Later, people tasted the "Cuccia", a traditional soup of wheat, corn and chickpea; some roast chestnut followed, accompanied by a glass of wine. This year a novelty has been introduced: a cookie named "D'uocchië d' Sanda Lucië" ("The eyes of S.Lucia"). It's an eye-shaped cookie, created by Gina Fusco (another committee member) using the "Cuccia" basic ingredients: they seem to have been really appreciated. The recipe follows, and we hope it can become another traditional component of this feast.

Let me thank whoever has contributed: the carriers of the statue (Vincenzo Calace, Paolo Rosa e Pasquale Marino, Marco Montagna e Gerardina Belarte), don Antonio, our Mayor, but especially the inhabitants, who gave economic and moral support to the committee. A greeting also to don Rocco, who was not physically present, but we're sure his heart was with us.

In Pignola, Santa Lucia means the beginning of Christmas period; therefore the committee wants to wish all citizens and all readers a

D'uocchië d' Sanda Lucië

Recipe by Gina Fusco

Ingredients:

- 250g whole-wheat flour
- 150g chickpea flour
- 125g maize starch
- 150g peeled and toasted almonds
- 225g sugar
- 225g melted butter
- 3 whole eggs
- 1 packet of yeast
- grated orange rind
- 1 tablespoon of cinnamon
- bitter cocoa

Preparation:

- put on the pastry board the flours, sugar, almonds, yeast, cinnamon, grated orange rind and mix all together, leaving in the middle a cavity where to put eggs and melted butter
- after a few minutes of knead, wrap the mixture in a food film and allow the dough to rest approximately one hour in the refrigerator.
- knead it again for a few minutes and then slice it in 4 parts (3 + 1 smaller)
- mix the smaller with 3 spoons of bitter cocoa (this portion will be used later)
- roll out with a rolling pin one of the 3 remaining (be careful to do not make it too much thin!) and, using an eye-shaped mould, obtain several cookies
- turn on the oven, setting it to about 160°-170°
- lay a sheet of baking paper in a baking dish, and put there the cookies (leave some space in between)
- roll out the "small" mixture (the one with cocoa) and obtain several little circe (again, not too much thin); each one will represent the pupil, so will be put in the center of each cookie
- place in the oven and cook for about 20 minutes (until they became slightly browned)
- repeat the above for all the dough portions

FESTIVITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY and FESTIVITY OF SAN ROCCO

September 2014

August: hot temperature, liveliness, cheerfulness, rest... some terms suggested by a basic brainstorming: simple concepts that make us relive a time of year when people needs to stop, to exclude a fast-paced life giving room to the hot climate that warms the hearth and allows to cultivate relationships with others, sometime living far away; they open heart, spirit and mind to the encounter with God!

It is no coincidence that August is the month where the faith and the popular devotion reach their top with two important festivities: the Assumption of Mary and the festivity of San Rocco (Co-Patron of Pignola).

Benedetto XVI, in his Angelus on Aug. 15, 2011 has clearly explained how the Church celebrates this day as the Paschal Mystery fulfillment:

"Today we celebrate a great mystery, it is mainly a mystery of hope and happiness for all of us; in Mary we see the objective towards which proceed all those which are capable to link their life to Jesus and to follow Him as Mary did.

Thus this festivity is related to our future, telling us that we will be beside Jesus in the joy of God and invites us to have courage, to believe that the power of Christ's resurrection can make us men and women that day by day try to live as resurrected, bringing the light of good in the evil darkness present in the world."

In fact, the tradition does not mention the death of Mary; rather, the word "dormition" is used, to underline how the Father wants to associate this to Jesus resurrection.

Near the humility of Mary ("Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word")

we have the example from San Rocco, disciple of Jesus, whose life reflect the words "I came to serve, not to be served"; in fact, he is one of the most revered saints all over the world. San Rocco, a reflection of God's holiness, is often invoked because of his miraculous virtues, and has an important place in the heart of Pignolesi.

A lot of believers have crowded the torchlight procession in honor of Mary on August the 15th, and the same happened for the procession in honor of San Rocco the day after, because of the strong devotion and the deep faith which moved so many people to trust in their intercession to become witnesses and missionaries of God's Word.



PILGRIMAGE TO MEDJUGORJE

April 21-26, 2014



The Spirit of the Risen Lord has characterized the pilgrimage to Medjugorje of some parishioners during the 8th week of Easter.

It has been a week full of spirituality, worship, joy and friendship that enforced the faith through feelings and emotions coming from the genuineness and simplicity of the visited sites, the people met, the climate of peace and serenity you can breathe here, where you perceive the presence of Mary, Queen of peace, and feel touched by the Grace of God.

After a stop-over in Loreto to enjoy the Easter Monday, we went to Ancona for embarking to Medjugorje.



Let's ask ourselves: why so many people do a pilgrimage to Medjugorje? Through the pilgrimage the man of faith expresses the human condition of an itinerant existence: dissatisfaction, alienation, homesickness, heartache, longing, hope; the pilgrimage is a trip characterized by proceed and target.



Proceed: desire of an experience of faith with God; target: the need to discover visible traces of the divine revelation of Incarnation, Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus, in the plan for the humanity Salvation of which Mary is instrument through the history of the Church.

The pilgrim knows that such traces have to be seen with the eyes of the heart, and they are capable to transform the life of the believer.

Thus, the pilgrimage becomes a symbol of faith, to be realized in the daily life towards an inner peace up to the final meeting with God.

Medjugorje is a target of conversion and prayer reflecting, in a different way, the apparitions of Our Lady in Lourdes and Fatima, where Mary calls all her children to a

conversion and a spiritual renewal through the faith, rediscovering the values lost in the current world; here in Medjugorje pilgrims feel all of the above within the simplicity and deepness of celebrations.



We went through the winding, stony path of Podbrdo, the hill of apparitions, where at the top is the beautiful sculpture of the Queen of Peace.

Then, we did the "Via Crucis" walkthrough up to the top of Krizevac mount, where a big cement cross is there to remind us the Redemption.

Later, a visit to the Shrine of Divine Mercy and a stroll throughout the wonders of nature up to the waterfalls.

The participants experienced the peace of the heart, entrusting themselves and the whole community of Pignola to Mary, and therefore when they had to come back there were emotion and nostalgia.

We want to thank our spiritual guide don Antonio Laurita and the travel organizer Pino Valentino, hoping to have the possibility to go again in Medjugorje.

In Oct. 11, 2012 the Holy Father Benedetto XVI launched the Year of the Faith, encouraging the observant to rediscover the values of the faith.

With the same spirit don Antonio Laurita, our parish priest, launched the *Peregrinatio Mariae*, entrusting to Our Lady of Trust the Pope's exhortation to have Her as a model for a deep spiritual renewal.

The peregrinatio started on Nov. 17, 2012, and represents an event having a missionary value for our of territory: the little, sweet statue of Our Lady of Trust is visiting each evening the hearth of a family, intended as Home of God.

The *peregrinatio* is also an opportunity for further reflections and renewal of our faith: She travels to allow everybody to understand how big is God's love.

This is confirmed by the expressions of the hosts, revealing trepidation and joyful emotion; and when someone cries, these are tears of joy.

As well, when She leaves to reach another family we cannot feel sad, thinking She's going to comfort another house, giving joy to children and elderly, to young couples and grandparents (sometimes left alone).

Each visit is a renewed celebration: we hope Mary to be the star in our journey of faith, and that God -through her intercession- makes the faith flourish in our community life.

MARIA SS. DEGLI ANGELI CONGREGATION

To remember the opening of the Main Church in Pignola twelve years after the 1980 earthquake, in May '92 the **Congregazione Universale Maria SS. degli Angeli** was created.

The Congregation is a free association of devotees that want to promote the devotion to Virgin Mary, whose statue is venerated in the Pantano shrine, contributing in taking care of the shrine itself, the Main Church and related infrastructures. In addition, the Congregation will celebrate a solemn Mass for all members, dead or alive, every month on the 3rd Saturday, and every year on November the 2nd for all deceased members.

The participation to spiritual goods is eternal for deceased, while for living people is related to the subscription duration. There are no particular commitments, unless to live as Christians.

We recommend:

- to attend every Holy Mass, mainly those in honour of Maria SS degli Angeli;
- to recite the prayer to Maria SS. degli Angeli;
- to pray the Rosary;

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Historical notes about churches in Pignola

MAIN CHURCH

The church is on the highest part of the town, called "Terra Vecchia"; it is made in local grey stones, and is dated back to XI century; the town grew around it.

Beginning XIII century there were various implementations and in 1400 Jacopo Trifosiano terminated the bell tower, having square plan with a cusp and whose corners are padded by sculpted symbols and figures.

The church collapsed because of the 1694 earthquake, and was reopen in 1789 after the rebuilding activities cured by Antonio Magni, which followed the Vanvitelli style, up to the status we see today, despite some damages suffered after 1857 and 1980 earthquakes.

In 1924 a lighting seriously damaged the cusp, that had to be removed (as of today, people is still waiting for the rebuilding).

The church has a latin cross plant, with a single nave with barrel vaulting, interrupted by nails at large windows, and by a dome topped by a lantern at the cross vault.

On the pendentives of the dome there are the four Evangelists, and along the vault some medallions report biblical scenes (high-relief in stucco).

Inside the church you can find wonderful works of art: paintings depicting S. Pietro Apostolo by Carlo Sellitto, S. Antonio da Padova e S. Diego by Filiberto Guma, the Madonna dei Martiri by Vincenzo Lombardo, Crocifissione and Madonna del Rosario (Pietrafesa school), S. Francesco di Paola by Feliciano Mangieri, a portiuncula (author unknown), some sculptures depicting S. Vito (XV century) and Mary Immaculate (XVII century).

S. ANTONIO ABATE

Today only the main structures and the monumental entrance are left from the original church made in '400; the rest is the result of several parts added in different times. Inside you'll find an age-old S.Antonio Abate statue, made of wood, and some interesting paintings.

The artistic stone portal was probably sculpted by the same artists which made the two Main Church gates; at the top there is a S.Antonio low relief.

The presbytery and the two shrines are dated 1892, while the bronze main door was installed in 2000 (Jubilee year).

In the central part of this door we have a man and a woman which raise up their infant, meaning that a new millennium is starting; on the left and right sides there are representations of biblical subjects related to Jubilee







S. ROCCO

This church was included in a convent of Capucins, when they abandoned the S.Michele convent to build this new one adjacent the church between 1590 and 1595. It had also a large vegetable garden with stables and barns. In 1865 the convent, dedicated to the SS. Salvatore, became a school, then a leper hospital and later an holiday camp, till 1948 when it was demolished to construct municipal buildings.

The church, dedicated since the beginning to S. Rocco, was damaged several times by earthquakes but every time it has been rebuilt thanks to people's devotion: they trusted the miracle worker born in Montpelier, mainly when there were pestilences.

The high altar, dated XVIII, is completely made of wood artfully inlaid, and has a ciborium dated XVI. It has been reconditioned after the 1980 earthquake.

The polyptych that decorates the front wall was made by Pietro Antonio Ferro between 1590 and 1595: it depicts the Transfiguration, the Eternal, the Annunciation, San Bonaventura, San Michele.

There is also a predella with Franciscan martyrs, the emblem of the commissioner and the artist self portrait.

You'll also notice a S.Rocco statue (XVII century) made by Nicola Fumo, that replaced an older one of which there are no more info.









MARIA SANTISSIMA DEGLI ANGELI SHRINE IN PANTANO

The Shrine is about 3 km distant from Pignola, where in the middle ages there was a Cistercians rural settlement that was later abandoned until in 1524 Leone X gave it to ecclesiastics of Pignola.

As per other Sanctuaries, the legend says that the chapel was built where a shepherd found by chance the Virgin image that today is in a recess of the portal.

The building we see today was built in neoclassic style in 1789, as reported by a latin inscription on the carved stone portal, to replace the church collapsed because of the 1694 earthquake.

The interior has a central nave with domed ceiling and two aisles with barrel vaults.

The church has been reopen Sept. 21st, 1986 after six years needed to repair the damaged caused by an earthquake.

Here there is the image of the Virgin of Angels, made in notched wood between 1577 and 1587 by Geronimo Arnone, and commissioned by Don Francesco Cammerota, apostolic notary in Pignola; initially she was venerated as Santissima Assunta.

The statue was covered by pure gold after the church rebuilding in 1789. This sanctuary has been damaged several times by earthquakes; when it was not accessible or during wars or pestilences the Virgin image was guarded into the Main Church.





Every year a ritual is renewed: in September the statue is carried from the Pignola main church to Pantano, and in May it comes back, always accompanied by a faithful crowd. This keeps happening regularly since more than 50 years, and in the past these processions happened more frequently, originated from severe problems impacting the population.

OTHER CHURCHES

The little **S. Lucia** church is located on a steep spur on S. Michele river, near the town. It was probably built on XV century, being already known in 1587 when it was restored by "masters Giorgio Olita and Carlo Boezio with the money given by the Pignola Hospice." This chapel, accessible through a stairway made in 2011, is open for the triduum of the Saint from Siracusa, with an high participation of devotees. The building needs restoration; the painting layers may hide some original elements. Inside the chapel, Santa Lucia is depicted with a polychrome wooden sculpture made by Geronimo Arnone in 1587.





The **Madonna delle Grazie** church was built replacing the San Giacomo church, and represented a meeting place for pilgrims going to Roma, to Monte S.Angelo on the Gargano, to Holy Land, or simply to reach the sanctuaries present in the vicinities. It was fully rebuilt in the last century by Potenza Civil Engineering, and inside there is a polychrome wooden sculpture (XVIII century) depicting the Virgin with the Child, which is venerated as Madonna delle Grazie (our Lady of Graces). The church is open to celebrate the masses only every July the 2nd

S.Michele's church is in the countryside, at the foot of San Bernardino mount, over a cave that is also dedicated to the cult of the Archangel Michael. Behind the chapel there are the ruins of the ancient convent of the Capuchins, built in XVI century and later abandoned to go in the new one near S.Rocco church, in the town. The church has been rebuilt around 80s, and has not particular architectural elements. In 1996 the S.Michele's statue (XV cent.) was stolen, so today there is a copy made in Ortisei. The church is open just on May the 8th and Sept. 29th, for the S.Michele feast. There are some folk legends about this site: one says that a donkey refused to carry the S.Michele statue to follow the friars that were abandoning the convent.





In Rifreddo there is the church dedicated to **S.Maria Madre della Chiesa**. Consecrated on Nov.8, 1967 by Monsignor Augusto Bertazzoni, it was donated by Potenza Municipal Authority on the occasion of his 90th birthday. It is made of reinforced concrete, that sustain wooden beams in form of a spiral pointing upward: they seem to compete with nearby secular beeches in searching the light..

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
